Group began reviewing strategies that had been prioritized at the February meeting.

- Overall objective "Focused approach to include prevention, intervention and recovery"
- Combined "Develop a no-wrong door approach" & "Decrease language barriers"
  - High priority, prevention
  - Implementation
    - Welcoming policies established within an agency
    - Central phone number/central point of intake
    - Trained peer specialist as first contact at an agency (phone/waiting room)
    - Web-based database of program resources, include eligible population and insurance information
  - Existing programs
    - Office on Aging is becoming a Maryland Access Point (MAP) which distinguishes it as the single point of entry for individuals with a disability/aging
    - Family Navigators serve anyone in the county in need of assistance locating and applying for support services
    - Peer specialists Health Department Division of Addictions, Mental Health (SPIN Drop in Center), Addictions Connections Resource (ACR)

- Combined "Decreasing youth alcohol use/drinking parties," "Increase parent involvement," and "Increase was to reach students through schools"
  - High priority, prevention
  - Cost relatively low, Office of Drug Control Policy is currently doing much of this work
  - Note: federal money for programming around underage drinking has been eliminated
- "Using public and social media: tv, radio, facebook, etc."
  - High priority, prevention
  - No/low cost
  - New Public Health Matters segment on addictions will be produced and aired this spring/summer.
  - Utilize existing websites such as HarfordYouth.org, SARC, Harford County Public Schools
  - Need to raise awareness of existing sites and connect them to one another
- Combined "Identify funding gaps" and "Managing the landscape of health care reform"
