

Test and Treat

If you are not sick

Get tested right away

-Provider/pharmacy -At-home tests* -Community sites -Test to Treat -State sites

If you test positive for COVID-19

Contact provider immediately for a prescription or referral

> -Oral antiviral -Remdesivir

Options for COVID-19 prevention and treatment continue to improve.

Talk to your doctor about the following:

Ask how to get the vaccine, and boost when recommended for your best defense against severe illness from COVID-19. Free clinics can be found at covidvax.maryland.gov.

If you have symptoms, test immediately. Free community testing sites can be found on covidtest.maryland.gov. Contact your local health department for information on where free at-home tests are available near you.

■ If you test positive, discuss whether you are eligible for treatment with your doctor right away. If you do not have a health care provider, go to an urgent care for evaluation and a prescription, if appropriate.

If you don't have a health care provider, call **410-649-6200**, the BCCFH Covid Task Force Call Center, for next steps.

*At-home tests

It is recommended that you keep rapid at-home tests to use at the first sign of symptoms.

If you test positive on an at-home test, contact your provider right away to see if oral antiviral treatments might be right for you.

■ If you test negative on an at-home test and still have symptoms, retest within 36 hours to check the results.

Test and Treat

Test to Treat (T2T)

Maryland pharmacies and health partners are participating in the federal Test to Treat (T2T) initiative to expand access to potentially life-saving COVID-19 treatments for all residents.

At T2T sites, people can get a rapid COVID-19 test and – if they test positive and treatments are appropriate for them – immediately receive a prescription and have it filled all at one location. There may be a charge associated with these services.

Test to Treat sites in Maryland are listed on the T2T locator, published by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), along with other pharmacies in Maryland that can dispense treatments.
