

Harford County Health Department Implements Nuestra Comunidad Program to Support Uninsured Populations

The Harford County Health Department is currently implementing a CHRC grant to support its Nuestra Comunidad/Our Community program, which provides health care and care coordination services to uninsured and undocumented individuals in Harford County. The program is currently providing dental health, mental health, immunizations, and care coordination services. Participants are screened for social determinants of health and given referrals to social services for nonmedical needs. Participants work with a bilingual care coordinator, who helps them navigate the program, community resources, and address their needs.

The Harford County Health Department has been actively building relationships in the community. In April 2023, it hosted a Noches de Chicas/Girls Night where female youth participated in self-care routines, mental health exercises, enjoyed food, and played games to build a stronger sense of community. Staff also donated clothes and set up a free "shop" where girls selected the items they wanted to keep.

Halfway through implementation, the program has already exceeded its overall goals. It has delivered family healthcare services to 205 participants, including 158 youth clients. 85 individuals were referred to services to meet nonmedical needs.






Harford County Number of Infant Deaths, 2017-2021





Low Birth Weight


Harford County and Maryland Low Birth Weight Percentage, 2016-2021

Low Birth Weight in Harford County by Race and Ethnicity, 2021




Substance Exposed Newborns (SEN)

Rate per 1,000 Live Births






Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS)



HUD Grant: Healthy, Happy Homes

- Eligibility
 - Homeowner
 - At Least 62 years of age
 - Low-income Harford County resident
- Home Modifications May Include
 - Temporary ramp
 - Shower chairs
 - Handheld shower head
 - Raised toilet seat
 - Risers for chairs & sofas
 - Non-slip strips



This grant program will provide minor to moderate home modifications that promote safety during self-care, reduce fall risk, and decrease the housing cost burden. This program is free to eligible seniors.





Total Number of Clinic Visits, FY19 - FY23



Top Causes of Mortality






Conditions Resulting in Most Hospitalizations in Harford County, 2022








Harford County Stroke Smart Proclamation

Lung Cancer was the single cancer type resulting in the most deaths in Harford County in 2021.



Age-Adjusted Cancer Mortality Rates in Harford County and Maryland, 2012-2021




Cancer mortality rates continue to decline in Harford County; however rates have historically been higher than the Maryland average.



In Harford County, 41% of female Medicare enrollees received an annual mammography screening.








HCHD Cancer Program Screenings by Type, HCHD, FY23

Age-Adjusted Diabetes Mortality Rates in Harford County and Maryland 2013-2021





Overall program goals:

Weight loss, increased physical activity, reduction of A1C

English

- April Cohort 13 participants, 21 sessions complete
- May Cohort 8 participants, 20 sessions complete
- October Cohort 11 participants, 5 Sessions complete
- Average weight loss for *April* and *May* Cohorts is <u>3.45% of starting weight</u>
- Average physical activity of <u>158 minutes/week</u>
- Average decrease in A1c is .2% reduction


Spanish

- July Cohort 14 participants, 19 sessions complete
- Average weight loss of <u>2.67% of starting weight.</u>
- Average physical activity of <u>150 minutes/week.</u>
- A1c to be checked on December 6, 2023
- November Cohort 14 participants
- Because the cohort is new, significant data has not been collected




Youth Obesity


Current Tobacco Use in Adults, Harford County, 2018-2020

Current Electronic Vapor Product Use in High School Students, Harford County, 2014-2022






Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

COPD Age-Adjusted Death Rates per 100,000, Harford County, 2016-2021



WHO WE ARE

Healthy Homes for Healthy Kids is a Maryland Department of Health Program between Medicaid, the Environmental Health Bureau, the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD), and the Harford County Health Department.

SERVICES

- A home visiting program with a Nurse and /or Community Health Worker to educate about maintaining a Healthy Home free of irritants and allergy-causing agents.
- Provide information, educational materials, and tools to maintain a Healthy Home based on the Principles of a Healthy Home: Dry, Well – Ventilated, Safe, Contaminant Free, and Clean.
- Work closely with you and your child's doctor to reduce symptoms and improve your child's health.
- Help parents reduce the environmental threats that can be harmful to their children.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Are a Harford County Resident under the age of 19
- · Enrolled in/eligible for Medicaid
- Have a Blood Lead level of 3.5 mcg/dL and above
- Have a diagnosis of Moderate to Severe Asthma

The Lead and Asthma Program provides home visiting services to families with children ages 0-19 who are diagnosed with moderate to severe asthma. Services include the following:


- Review medications


Asthma ED Visits by Race in Children age 0-17, Harford County, 2022



HIV Prevalence, Harford County & Maryland, 2020




Harford County's prevalence for HIV is much lower compared to the state's HIV prevalence.




Hospital Visits per 1,000 for Any Mental Health Condition, Harford County and Maryland 2019-2022


ED visits for anxiety have decreased by 46.6% since 2020.

Rates of ED visits for anxiety are higher in the African American/Black population compared to others in Harford County.





Hospitalizations for Depression, Harford County, 2017-2022



Hospitalizations for Depression per 1,000 by Race, Harford County, 2022



Total Intoxication Deaths per 1000, Harford County and Maryland,




2021 saw a slight increase in intoxication deaths per 1,000 Harford Residents


