Civil Surgeon Program Presentation- Dr. Frank Sparandero

- The civil surgeon is a physician who provides medical services to the immigrant population
 - TB tests
 - Blood and urine tests for STI's
- Must have an MD or DO and active state-issues medical license
- Be certified by the US Citizen and immigration services (USCIS) which is a function of the United States Department of Homeland Security.

- The civil surgeon program began at HCHD in the Winter of 2024. Adults only

- What does the exam include? Review of immunizations, TB exam, STI exam, Leprosy exam, and a history and physical exam.
- LHIC goals being met: prevent chronic disease, improving health across the lifespan
- The medical portion is free and immunizations and blood tests are on a sliding scale fee
- If there is no record of a certain vaccine, the physical will start over and provide every vaccine that is required.
